TODAY'S RUNNER LEAGUE

For those of you new to the Club, you may care to consider taking part in this "friendly" cross country league. The league is used for our own cross country championships and you must compete in 5 out of the 7 races to be eligible for trophies at our Club Presentation held in December 1997. The races which start at 11am are usually approximately 5 miles. At most venues there are also junior races. The dates given are as follows:-

Qualification for this is either:

Born in Greater London area; has not less than 1 years bona fide residence; not less than 1 years continuous full-time employment or not less than 1 years full time attendance at an educational establishment.

The distances will be approximately 6 miles for the men and 3 miles for the women at Parliament Hill, Hampstead Heath.

You will need to notify Bonny by no later than *Thursday*, *24th October* if you would like to run.


