### LE TOUQUET 10K - SATURDAY 6 JULY 2002

Those runners who fancy a PB, this is the course to do it. Fast, flat and very pleasant along the seafront and through the wooded avenues of Le Touquet. Having personally run it eight times I can thoroughly recommend it.

Roy Gooderson has done his usual sterling job of organising the trip for Harriers. The coach cost £18 for senior Harriers, £20 for non-members and £10 for children who MUST be accompanied by an adult who is not running the race.

The race entry fee is 8 Euros in advance. Roy will preenter you if you sign up early.

All the times shown below are LOCAL times, some may be subject to change on the day.

Coach pick-up times:

06.55 Faversham, Love Lane Cemetery.

07.20 Canterbury, Bat & Ball Pub. Opposite County

Cricket Ground. Old Dover Road.

07.45 Dover Dock Entrance by the Petrol Station.

The Ferry Dover - Calais is at 08.45

It is suggested that you have a substantial breakfast on the ferry, allowing for a light lunch/picnic en route. As usual we will be stopping to shop at the Auchan Hypermarket near Boulogne. Apart from the obvious beer and wine supplies this is a good opportunity to get you provisions for lunch. If everybody gets back to the coach at the agreed time, we will head to Wimeraux for a beach picnic. We should reach Le Touquet some time in midafternoon. The coach will be parked close to the sports stadium. This is only a short walk to shops and seafront for non-runners. Showers and toilets are available, if open.

The 10k starts at 17.00.

After the race we will leave Le Touquet heading towards Calais, with hopefully a drink stop at Boulogne Old Town if time allows.

The ferry departs Calais at 22.15.
